Quick facts about the 2020 Census:

The data collected by the census determines the number of seats each state has in the U.S. House of Representatives (a process called apportionment) and is used to distribute billions in federal funds to local communities.

What is the Census?

The U.S. Census counts every resident in the United States. Article I, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution mandates that this occurs every 10 years.

Why a Census?

The information the census collects helps determine how more than \$675 billion of federal funding is distributed to states and communities each year.

History of the Census

Thomas Jefferson led the first census in 1790. It had six questions - name of head of family and the number of persons in each household in five categories.

Redistricting Data Program

Public Law 94-171 requires the census to provide state legislatures with the small area census population tabulations necessary for legislative redistricting.
