WHAT IS A MARRIAGE-BUILDING PARISH GRANT?

Funding has been provided to award a *Marriage-Building Parish Grant* to three selected parishes in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. These selected parishes will be open to piloting an exciting new strategy that seeks to revolutionize how a parish addresses and meets the spiritual and relational needs of its marriages and families. Each Grant will provide up to \$50,000 worth of organizational leadership and effective training from the staff of MarriageBuilding-ConstruyendoMatrimonios USA (MBUSA), a non-profit with over 40 years of experience in marriage and family ministry, with the collaboration of staff from the Archdiocese of Atlanta's Office of Intercultural Ministries and Office of Formation and Discipleship. This is a two-year partnership between each of the three selected parishes and MBUSA (with the Archdiocese of Atlanta offices noted above and the Catholic Marriage Initiative Fund, our major funder).

MBUSA, in collaboration with the Archdiocese, will operate as strategic consultants, trainers, and resource providers for the sake of advancing marriage and family life, evangelization and pastoral care at no expense to the parish. Also included will be promotional and training videos, banners and other innovative resources and materials, in both English and Spanish, that will better engage parishioners and mobilize marriages and families as catalysts of evangelization and discipleship. Participant workbook costs in some program offerings will be passed along to participants. Additional support in terms of time and talent will come from the Archdiocese and other collaborators.

The work of MBUSA will complement existing parish efforts and serve the larger scope of archdiocesan goals toward parish and family life renewal. Particular attention would be given to the following three areas of marriage and family life ministry: renewing marriage preparation by promoting a marriage catechumenate (marriage preparation that evangelizes and accompanies, connecting the couple to the community); ongoing accompaniment of married couples and families that supports Christian families as agents of evangelization and missionary discipleship; and pastoral care for marriages and for those with relational woundedness.

Key areas of focus and timing will ultimately depend on parish needs and discernment in consultation with the pastor and parish staff. In general, MBUSA would include training for leaders and volunteers to foster effective

marriage and family ministries, the establishment of pastoral care initiatives for marriages, and strategies to sustain long-term efforts beyond the confines of this Grant.

This Grant will provide culturally appropriate events and initiatives in the parish to foster ecclesial integration among the diverse cultural population in the Archdiocese.

Envisioned time commitments would include at least eighteen (18) months of preparation, programming and training, with six (6) months dedicated to sustainability.
