Experience the Church's mission on the margins

Catholic Extension's mission is to build churches and the Church among the marginalized in the poorest regions of our country. Since our founding in 1905, we have helped build over 12,500 churches, and today, through the support of donors, we financially support faith communities on the peripheries and their leadership in 87 of the 195 dioceses of the United States.

Our Mission Immersion Program invites priests and other pastoral ministers to experience firsthand the Church's inspiring and diverse missionary work in under-resourced regions of the United States and its territories, while forming bonds with fellow pastoral leaders both at home and in the mission communities they visit.

We seek to invite participants with an openness to learning to a 3-day, all expenses paid, mission immersion trip. Past participants have described the trips as memorable, formative experiences of some of the most hopeful work the Church is doing in our country.

From those who travel:

- "Visiting places like Eastern Kentucky and the Indian reservations where the Church is in the minority opened my eyes to the challenge of the Church and...also deepened my respect for the work it does."
- "The more we travel, the more open minded we get, when you see the south vs the north and the way the Church operates...It makes everyone aware of different situations. People in smaller areas know they are not alone, [the visit] helps them see...beyond their circumstance."

Tim is a theologian, professor, and author/editor of twelve books on Ignatian spirituality, the theology of the laity, and marriage and family spirituality. He was the inaugural director of the Church in the 21st Century Center at Boston College, and later served for ten years in the University's Office of Mission and Ministry. He served on Catholic Extension's mission committee for five years before joining the organization full time in 2017.
