The theme of the gathering is ***Keeping Hope Alive: The Christian Journey of Peace.***

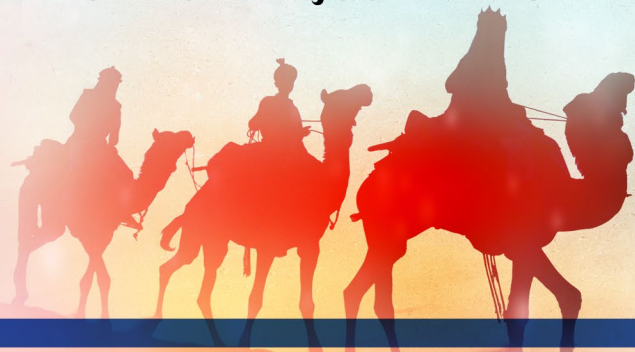
Priests and deacons are invited to vest and process (either a cassock and surplice, or an alb and violet stole). Please encourage parishioners and other interested individuals and groups to attend.

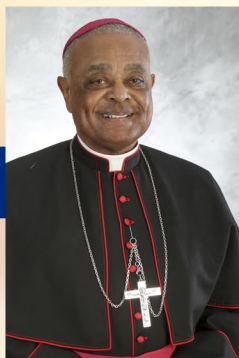
