U.S. culture tends to look at raising children as a private choice, but Catholic teaching sees it as a valuable gift to the wider society, one which society in its turn has a duty to support. This talk will discuss the view of care for young children in Catholic social thought: how the Church views it as valuable work; how it fits with paid work parents may do outside the home; and how society should support it.



**Kate Ward** is an assistant professor of theology at Marquette University. She is the author of Wealth, Virtue, and Moral Luck: Christian Ethics in an Age of Inequality (Georgetown University Press, 2021.) Her research on economic ethics and ethical method has appeared in journals including Theological Studies, the Journal of Religious Ethics, American Journal of Economics and Sociology, and the Journal of the Society of Christian Ethics. Before earning her Ph.D. in theological ethics at Boston College, she worked in the labor movement helping organize workers in Catholic healthcare settings. She also holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Harvard and an M.Div. from Catholic Theological Union.
