



NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival



Phase 1:

Initial Preparation
(Before June 18th)

Eucharistic Revival Missionaries tasks

Pray: Pray for the Eucharistic Congress and the fruits of the National Eucharistic Revival
Promote: Promote the 25th Eucharistic Congress. Encourage individuals and families to participate
Attend: Attend the EC and the closing Mass (to receive a special blessing and commissioning by Archbishop Hartmayer)

Phase 2:

Encounter and
Formation
(June 19, 2022 –
June 11, 2023)

Pray: Dedicate a set time every week for Adoration
Form: Participate in the Virtual Eucharistic Conference (TBD), and in other formation opportunities through the year
Support: Prayerfully, and in consultation with your pastor, form a Eucharistic Revival Team to start planning initiatives for the parish year and build or strengthen a Eucharistic culture at the parish
Encounter and Healing: Participate in the virtual Rescue Project, as a group with all other Eucharistic Missionaries.
Attend a morning of reflection (venue TBD) with the group of Eucharistic Missionaries
Network: Participate in frequent zoom calls with the group

Phase 3:

Parish Year
(June 11, 2023-
July 17, 2024)

Continue and Deepen: In consultation with the pastor and his staff, and together with the parish teams, work to achieve goals of the ER, seeking to “heal, convert, form, and unify” the parish through encounters with the Person of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. ***Emphasis on reaching families and parish small groups
Continue to Foster Encounter and Preach the Kerygma: Participate and promote Rescue Project Live (Acts XXIX- Fr. John Riccardo) September 9, 2023

Phase 4:

National Eucharistic

ary Sending
(July 17, 2024 – June
8, 2025)

Attend the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis (Optional)
