Even without live performances this season, local audiences won't have to miss out on the sounds of the holidays, thanks to the new Georgia's Home for the Holidays' virtual music video series, which premieres Nov. 27, 2020, on YouTube and Facebook.

Led by the Georgia Symphony Orchestra and Chorus, Atlanta Master Chorale and The Michael O'Neal Singers, the series features hundreds of the metro area's leading choral and instrumental musicians from 32 ensembles. Participating groups are members of the Choral Music of Metro Atlanta collaborative, and are based as far north as Gainesville and as far south as Peachtree City, Ga.

Daily *Georgia's Home for the Holidays'* videos will feature a single participating choral or orchestral ensemble sharing artistic content related to expressions of the winter holiday season. Beginning the morning after Thanksgiving, episodes will premiere daily, then be revisited at any point thereafter. Episodes are available at <u>holidays.georgiasymphony.org</u>. Viewers may also register there to have the videos delivered to them directly via email. The daily videos will also be available on the Georgia Symphony Orchestra's Facebook and YouTube pages.

Timothy Verville, music director and conductor of the Georgia Symphony Orchestra, is the creative force behind the project's extensive audio and video editing. Marietta-based businessman Ira Jackson, Jr. lends his bass voice to introduce each day's video.

suburban reach, drawing singers and audiences from throughout metropolitan Atlanta. Artistic Director Eric Nelson has led Atlanta Master Chorale since 1999. Throughout its nearly four decades of development, Atlanta Master Chorale has consistently celebrated material drawn from a broad spectrum of choral music. Atlanta Master Chorale audiences enjoy nearly 100 different pieces over four concerts each season, featuring music from nearly every period and genre, including historic and newly commissioned a cappella songs as well as major and minor accompanied works. The ensemble's choral series, published by MorningStar/E.C. Schirmer, captures new repertoire premiered by Atlanta Master Chorale, helping to add vibrant new music to the choral field. Choral Music of Metro Atlanta (CMMA) is an informal choral roundtable for leaders, both staff and volunteer, of Atlanta-area volunteer choral music organizations. Stemming from work by the Audience Building Roundtable (an initiative of The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation), administrative leaders of Atlanta Master Chorale, Georgia Symphony Orchestra and Chorus, and The Michael O'Neal Singers reached out to local choruses and began meeting in late 2017. CMMA exists to foster support and collaboration among our Atlanta choral community and raise collective awareness of the diverse vocal music organizations available in our area of northern Georgia. During the COVID-19 situation, CMMA has been meeting via Zoom to exchange information on critical topics such as scenario planning, participant and audience engagement, scientific resources on safe singing, and options for virtual choral programming.
