In every city where the **National Eucharistic Pilgrimage** stops, the pilgrims have offered to do a day of service for the local community. This pilgrimage will be in the Archdiocese of Atlanta June 21-23.

In solidarity with the pilgrims, I am calling all parishes and families to participate in an **Archdiocesan Parish Day of Eucharistic Service on June 22**.

Consider offering opportunities for your parishioners to serve the needs of their community in some way, and to ground that service in Mass and/or in prayer before our Eucharistic Lord. For some, this could mean partnering with your local St. Vincent de Paul for a food or clothing drive or partnering with your local Knights of Columbus Council.
