Re:	National Migration Week – September 20-26

National Migration Week will take place September 20-26, culminating in the Vatican's World Day for Migrants and Refugees.

The primary theme for this year' WDMR is "Towards an ever wider 'WE". In his letter announcing this year's theme, Pope Francis emphasizes that this focus calls on us to ensure that "after all this, we will think no longer in terms of 'them' and 'those,' but only 'us" (*Fratelli tutti*, no. 35). This universal "us" must become a reality first of all within the church which is called to cultivate communion in diversity.
